POSITION SUMMARY

We are looking for an experienced and dynamic half-time teacher to lead one of our 3rd-4th grade classes. This position is for one of the classes and will be responsible for all language arts and social studies, and math for 4th grade. The two classes will have math at the same time, so that the students can work in grade level groups. A teacher's aide is shared with the other 3rd-4th grade class during the morning hours, ensuring a low child-to-adult ratio. The two classroom teachers will have time for collaboration, and may choose to plan and implement some curriculum and project based learning together. A variety of specialty classes, including Spanish, music, PE, and science, are taught by other faculty throughout the week. The school day is from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm Monday through Friday.
